Welcome to Summer! So many changes occurred this past quarter, we'd be remiss if we didn't mention them here. With so many changes, there's never a dull moment!

On the legislative front, the session ended in May, and we're happy to report, we finally saw some relief—for the first time since 2015! There are no major changes for 2023, but these changes will greatly impact the years ahead, starting in 2024.

- **Disability Waiver Rate System (DWRS):** The legislature invested over \$300 million dollars into the DWRS through the 2027 legislative session. They increased the Competitive Workforce Factor by 2% (now up to 6.7%) and moved the inflationary adjustment schedule to January 2024.
- ICF/DD Rate Adjustments: Rates for our ICF/DD homes (6-bed homes) increased by \$40 per day.
- Workforce Recruitment and Retention Bonuses: \$90 million dollars allocated for direct care staff to receive one-time retention bonuses.

We also welcomed several new faces this quarter! We have a new Director of Nursing Brandi Sterry, and Nurse Consultants Lydia Scherr-Demzuk and Nicole Usuku. Internally, former Program Manager Dede Muimba moved to our Nurse Educator position, and former APD Kim Phillips became our new Program Director. We've also welcomed several new Program Managers and Program Supervisors this quarter. Please join us in welcoming these new team members! Have a wonderful summer!
